Oberling Farms of Payson IL

90 Bred Heifers- These heifers are all native source black and bwf big fancy heifers. They have all been handled with a complete health program and breeding protocols. They will be mated to Registered Sydenstricker heifer qualified calving ease Angus bulls to start calving February 10th for 60 days. Justin has been developing replacement heifers for several years with several repeat buyers and has commented that this is "easily the nicest set of heifers" he has ever offered.

Korsmeyer Farms- Alahambra IL

80 Bred Heifers - These nice first calf black and black baldie heifers are all sourced locally and will average near 1200 pounds. They are due to start calving January 15 to registered calving ease Angus bulls. The Korsmeyer's have been developing replacement heifers for over ten years, and are offering a uniform sort out of 240 head in this year's program.

The Late Eric Heitman of Elsberry MO

67 Cow Dispersal. Eric passed away Oct 9th as a result of a farming accident at the family farm in Elsberry. His widow Sarah has decided to offer a complete herd dispersal of 67 cows and two HampAn Angus bulls. These cows are best described as black large frame Angus crossbred cows with a few large red Limousin crossbred cows mixed in that are believed to run from 4 years old and up. 23 will be late Spring calvers with big calves to be spilt off on sale day or before. 15 are calving now that will be in the third period or with young late fall calves by side on sale day. The largest grouping of 29 are late summer early fall pairs that have been exposed to the HampAn bulls starting Sept 15.

Kall Farm in Centralia MO

60 Cows- These will be mostly young three to six year old black hided cows along with 5 red cows. A pair of good black bulls were turned in the first of May and an Angell Thomas Charolais bull was added 6 weeks later. These will be very nice big native cows in good condition due to plentiful grass all summer long.

Randy Hammett of Bloomington IL

50 Pair Dispersal This will be a dispersal of the fall calving herd of mostly Angus Crossbred cows running from young to mature and weighing mostly from 1250 to 1450 pounds. Cows are in good shape out on good pasture and supplemented with a little silage. All should have calves sired by high performance Angus or Simmental bulls some with big calves but all worked once with a round of shots. These cows will be unexposed so that the new owner can mate them back to the bull of their choice.

Spring Creek Farm of Plainville IL

40 Young Cows These cows will run from 4 bred heifers to 5 and 6 year old cows bred to fancy Sydenstricker Angus Bulls to start calving February 16. They are current with their health program, and 35 will be black and bwf cows averaging around 1300 pounds and 5 bigger Red Angus cows averaging around 1400 pounds, all fancy top calf makers.

Bill Richards - Keytesville MO

30 Black Bred Heifers. These fancy Nebraska origin heifers will be pasture bred to calving ease Angus bulls that are sons of Bismark and Final Answer. For added value they will be ultra-sounded for a tight calving season of around 14 days in February starting 15. There is a complete health program including pelvic measuring, reproductive shots and scour guard and leptos boosters. The Richard's families have been developing replacements for well over 40 years and have refined the sourcing of heifers from the same reputation ranches for several years running building one of the most notable private heifer development programs in central Missouri.

Mike and Travis Duenke of Laddonia MO

42 young fall pairs. These will be young pairs all exposed back to an Angell Thomas Charolais Bull. There should be twenty-five black pairs from four years old to solid mouth with mostly black calves by side. There will be ten fancy three year old second calf Red Angus heifer pairs with Charolais crossbred calves by their sided. And then there will be seven Charolais and Angus cross bred heifers coming with their first or second Angus sired calf by side. All of these fall pairs will be exposed back to a good Charolais bull.

Gary Stowers of Centralia MO

16 Cows. These will be mostly black hided crossbred cows running from young to old. They will be Spring Calving cows mated back with a good Angell Thomas Charolais bull.

Jeff Kuntz of Silex MO

15 Young Cows. These will be moderate frame second calf black hided heifers bred to spring calve to good black bulls. They will have sound udders, a good gentle disposition that are proven producers.

Paul Smith of Greenfield, IL

12 Young Cows. These young black and bwf second calf heifers are home raised and all had good calves last year. They will be bred back to a good Reg. Angus bull from Rhodes Angus Farm in Carlinville IL to start calving Feb 21 for a 72 day calving season. This will be another young high quality offering that would be hard to find anywhere else.

Maple Oaks Red Angus of Tuscombina MO

10 Red Angus- These will be registered Red Angus Cows from three to five years old bred to start calving the end of March thru April. These will be the nice 1350 pound cows that are bred for carcass performance. Representative photos of Maple Oaks Red Angus can be seen on their web page.

Tony Wilmes of Hawk Point MO

9 Half-Sisters. These first calf commercial Angus heifers will all be half sisters sired by Byergo Stryker. They were AI 17th of May to Byergo Andy and clean-up bred to a Redwood Red Angus bull to start calving Feb 25. These fancy large frame heifers should average between 1100 and 1200 pounds and have a complete health and breeding program and offer a complete genetic package to build a herd around.

Perry Yoder - Bowling Green MO

6 Black Pair. These running age cows will be mostly young nice black cows with fancy Sydenstricker Angus sired calves by their side that started coming early September.

D&D Simmental of Troy MO

3 Black Simmental Bulls. Two of these bulls will be coming two year old Reg. black Simmental virgin bulls that have been examined by Dr Cerven DVM and ready to go. One will be a purebred black Simmental virgin bull coming yearling in January that will be offered un-papered to be grown into service. The genetics base made popular locally by the late Carroll Feldman's Simmental program.

Ethan Decker of Shelbina MO

Shorthorn bull. This will be a coming 3 year old red roan Shorthorn bull that will be trich tested negative and semen tested as a good breeder before sale day.
